- They will make dua for us and Allah will help us.


After that she went to South Africa as the representative of India in 1932. After the Indian Independence from the British rule in 1947, Sarojini Naidu was appointed as the Governor of the Uttar Pradesh and she became the first Indian woman Governor.

She died of a heart attack on March 2, 1949, while working in her office in Lucknow. Sarojini Naidu's birthday is celebrated as National Women's Day of India every year.

Sarojini Naidu was born on 13th February 1879 in Hyderabad. She was the eldest daughter of her parents. She was intelligent and at the age of 13, she wrote a poem called "Lady of the Lake". Sarojini Naidu is also known as 'Nightingale of India' or 'Bharat Kokila' because of her poems. Her writing style is traditional and simple.

She was an Indian Political activist and poet. She participated in the Indian National movement for the independence of the country. She was appointed as the President of the Indian National Congress in 1925, because of Naidu's political and educational abilities.

The First Muslim Teacher Of India – Fatima Sheikh

Fatima Sheikh was an Indian educator and a colleague of the social reformers Jyotibha Phule and Savitribai Phule. Fatima Sheikh is one of the first Muslim women teachers of modern Indian who started educating Dalit children in Phules School.

Jyotibha Phule and Savitribai Phule were abandoned by every one around, the duo searched for shelter to live in and to fulfill their educational dreams for the oppressed section of the society. During their search, they came across a Muslim man Usman Sheikh who was living in Ganj Peth of Pune. Usman Sheikh offered his home to the couple and agreed to run a school in the premises. In 1848 a school was opened in the house of Usman Sheikh and her sister Fatima Shiekh. It was no surprise that almost everyone from the upper caster of Poona was against the practices of Fatima and Savitribai, and there were even attempt to stop them by social humiliation.

It was Fatima Sheikh who stood firmly and supported Savitribai's cause in every possible manner. Fatima Sheikh started teaching in the same school with Savitribai Phule.

According to archives from that period, it was Usman Sheikh who encouraged her sister Fatima to spread the education in the society. When Fatima and Savitribai started going to schools which were established by Jyotiba, people from Pune itself used to harass them and abuse them. They were stone pelted and sometimes cow dung was thrown at them as it was unimaginable. Despite threats ,she used to go door-to-door to Muslim households and explain the importance of girls education.

Fatima used to spent hours counseling parents who did not wish to send their girls to schools. In 2014 Fatima Sheikh's brief profile was included in the school Urdu textbooks of Bal Bharati Maharashtra State Bureau along with the likes of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan , Zakir Hussain, Abul Kalam Azad .

Although some from the Maratha community objected to the same. Fatima Sheikh is now widely regarded as the first Muslim woman teacher of the 19th century and it is a badge which Indian Muslim community wears with pride. On January 9th 2022 Google honoured Fatima Sheik, a reformer and educationist, with a doodle on its homepage on her 191st birth anniversary.
